



Higher Education Opportunity Act Disclosures

The American InterContinental University System (“AIUS” or “AIU System”) acquired the assets of Trident University International (“Trident”) on March 2, 2020. As of that date, Trident students are classified as students who transferred to AIUS. That group of Trident students are only included in data which includes transfer students since they are not first-time students at AIUS. Trident students will be included in these disclosures in future years when they reach the cohort included in the respective rates provided below.

The AIU System acquired the assets of California Southern University (“CalSouthern”) on July 1, 2022. As of that date, CalSouthern students are classified as students who transferred to AIUS. That group of CalSouthern students are only included in data which includes transfer students since they are not first-time students at AIUS. CalSouthern students will be included in these disclosures in future years when they reach the cohort included in the respective rates provided below.

In November 2020, AIU adopted the American InterContinental University System model. Today, the AIU System is composed of three member institutions: American InterContinental University, California Southern University, and Trident University International. The System will continue to report consolidated data in the manner described above.

The rates provided below are historical rates for the AIUS prior to the addition of CalSouthern and Trident and should not be relied upon by prospective students who enroll in a California Southern University or Trident University International program.

2022 Graduation Rates by Race/Ethnicity, Gender, and Pell Grant/Direct Subsidized Loan Recipients

The cohort consists of all full-time degree-seeking undergraduate students entering college for the first time in fall 2016. The graduation rate is the percent of the cohort graduating within 150% normal time for the program.

Retention Rates

(First time undergraduate Bachelor's degree student retention rates)

The AIU System's retention rate is based on students who enrolled at AIUS during the period of July 1 – October 15 for the respective year listed below, as reported to the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS). The students contained in the calculation only represent a subset of the AIUS student population as a whole. The student subset below did not attend another college or university prior to enrolling in a Bachelor's Degree program at AIUS. The calculation reflects the percentage of students who began their studies in the fall and continued their studies as of the following fall. This is the most current retention data available as last collected by IPEDS during their 2022-23 collection.

This section does not include CalSouthern students since they became part of the AIU System after the indicated fall cohorts. The 2019 cohort retention rates do not include Trident students since they became part of the AIU System after the fall 2019 cohort.
